the House with some very practical remarks. He said he had taken some touble to make a few calculations, which although not dealing with figures, he would quote. We were now a first-class power (laughter), and he would comsare our administrative expenses with those of other first-class nations. Great Britain, with thirty millions of population, 658 members of Parliament, and with three hundred and sixty millions of revenue had fifteen heads of departments; or in the proportion of one to two million of people, to every 23 millions of revenue. This basis, if adopted here, would give us two heads for our population; or giving into account the comparative extent of business and the amount of money handled, only one. (Laughter) The United Stated had 30 millions of population, 240 members of the popular branch, and seven heads of departments; or in the proportion of one to every 4 millions of people, every. 33 representatives, and every 70 millions of coppulation of 35 millions with a Corps Legislator, gallant and refined people (laughter) represented in the Cabinet by our Minister of war (laughter), there was a population of 35 millions of dollars. For all these there was 11 heads of departments or one to every 34 million people, to every 26 legislators, to every 34 millions of revenue. The same basis would give Cansia one head as regards population, but as regards revue, one of their heads was worth two of ours. (Great laughter). Each of their heads represented as large a revenue as it took our fifteen to manage together. How did it happen that the Minister for war was only one-15th the capacity of his countrymen at home, and was his degeneracy to be traced to the accident of his having been born in Canada? Our 13 heads represented each but 300,000 people, and but 13 members of Parliament. Indeed he was well aware that some of the 13 could neck command the adhesion of nearly so large a number. (Cheers and laughter.) He could prefer to see the salaries of the 13 dividanong 7; a number which would be quiet with which
