Little Rock, April 20, 7 p.m.-Baxter's forces are making noisy demonstrations which extend almost in every direction. The Federal forces are between the two contending parties, and two pieces of artillery are placed at the intersection of Louisana and Second streets. At least half of Baxter's troops are coloured and over half of Brook's.

10:30 p.m.-The Federal forces drove back the sentinels of Baxter on Second street, from Main to Scott to-night. They refuse to let any of Baxter's force pass beyond Main street, or any of the State House party to come further to-wards Baxter's than Louisiana street.

A despatch from Pine Bluffs states. that an attempt will be made to forward to Brooks a company of colcred men from there, and that Baxter's men will from there, and that backers men will prevent them leaving. The city is un-usually quiet for this hour, beyond the steady tramp of sentinels and the chang-ing of guards, all is quiet. Business is entirely suspended and the city is nothing but a military camp.
