Chicago, June 25.—Statements that
contrary to first reports the burnt district of South Dakota had not been
touched by rain except in a few spots
rallied the wheat market today from a
sharp set-back. The close was firm
at prices varying from 1-8 to 1-4 under last hight, to 1-8 above.

What appeared to be a general rainfall over the spring crop region kept
wheat on the down grade during the
first haif of the session. Bears took
the aggressive, particularly on a message telling of an inch of rain near
Aberdeen, S.D., where some of the
worst effects of the heat and drouth
have developed. Later news, however,
declared that the greater part of eight
counties, embracing 1,100,000 acres in
the Jim river valley, had not yet been
relieved.

Recovery was added by tidings that
many western zections of both North
and South Dakota, no matter what
happened, would only be enough for
seed. There were also estimates that
teh total spring crop would fall tor.
100,000,000 bushels compared with 1912.
Cash demand was good for milling.
Seaboard clearances of wheat and
flour equalled 229,000 bushels. Primary receipts of wheat were 644,000
against \$36,000 a year ago.
