# WOOLFORD WILL MARKET \$100,000 WORTH OF HOGS

The Woolford district will market 4,000 head of fat hogs this fall, in addition to a wide variety of other products, according to the statement of E. B. McTigue, who was in the city yesterday. Mr. McTigue is a merchant at Woolford, and says that section is going in for mixed farming on an extensive scale, having learned by past experience that wheat farming, while profitable, is more or less of a gamble.

The hog output alone will bring to the people of any community \$100,000 this fall, said Mr. McTigue. "And I anticipate that next season twice as many hogs will be marketed from our country."
