

DEATH OF A. E. SUTHERLAND

One of Glencoe's Oldest Citizens Succumbs in 93rd Year

Mr. Arthur Eliot Sutherland, one of this town's oldest and highly respected citizens, passed away at six o'clock Tuesday morning, September 29th, aged 92 years. Mr. Sutherland had been in poor health for some time and had been practically confined to bed for two years.

He was born in Ekfrid Township and was the last surviving member of the family of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Sutherland. In 1894 he was married to Miss Ada Anderson, of Newbury, who survives him. There are also three daughters, Mrs. H. J. Jamieson (Jean), of Guelph; Mrs. Scott Irwin (Eleanor), of Windsor, and Miss Frances, at home; also three grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

His father, the late William Sutherland, was the founder of the London Free Press, and after selling that paper in the early 1870's he came to Glencoe and commenced publication of The Transcript. In early youth Arthur Sutherland started work in this plant and afterwards was editor and publisher for a great many years. In 1934 he retired, selling out to Richard Singleton, present editor.
