Manager Lynch and Dan Stuart are to have an interview today, and the Sharkey-Maher fight may be managed for Nevada. Stuart offered \$5,000 for a fight between Tom Sharkey and Peter Maher, but it is stated that Sharkey has a standing offer from a New York club for a purse of \$10,000 for a limited round contest.

### PHOTOGRAPHING THE FIGHT.

Orange, N. J., Feb. 20.—Thomas A. Edison will have the monopoly of picture-making at the Fitzsimmons-Corbett fight. The four machines used in the recent Fitzsimmons-Sharkey fight will be used at Carson. The size of the film picture will be 2 1/4 by 2 1/2 inches, and 3,000 of these can be taken in a minute.

### HOCKEY.

#### QUEEN'S THE WINNER.

The first of the home and hotel matches for the senior championship of the Ontario Hockey Association was played on Friday night at Toronto, between Queen's and Varsity teams. There was an attendance of about 1,500. It was an easy victory for Queen's by 6 to 1. The return match will be played at Kingston on Monday, and the victory of Queen's is a foregone conclusion.

#### AT PARIS.

A fast and exciting hockey match came off at Paris on Friday night between Paris and Simcoe teams, the visitors being defeated by 6 to 4. In the beginning of the last half the teams were a tie—4 to 4—and excitement was great, but in the thirteen minutes left to finish, Paris, by good work, secured 2 goals.

#### AYER VS. INGERSOLL.

Ayer defeated Ingersoll on Friday night in a friendly game of hockey, by 7 to 6.

#### AT WINDSOR.

A hockey tournament began at

Windsor on Friday. In the afternoon the Cass Farm and Forest Avenue teams, of Detroit, failed to put in an appearance, and the Windsor and Chatham teams played an exhibition game, resulting in a score of 2 to 0 in favor of Chatham. In the evening Cass defaulted to Chatham, and Windsor defeated Forest Avenue by a score of 20 to 2.

#### WHEEL.

NEW IDEA IN GEARING. A new idea in gearing that is simple and helpful is that of putting two sprockets on the hub of the rear wheel. An eight-tooth sprocket is placed on the right end and a seven-tooth on the left. With a main sprocket having twenty teeth this affords a change from a 70 to an 80 gear by taking out the rear wheel and turning it around. The plan lacks the instantaneous virtue of the changeable gear mechanism, but it does not, like them, encumber and disfigure the wheel or entail any extra expense.

#### SPOKES.

The total membership of the C. W. A., according to the list published in the official organ, is 9,386. The Chatham club has a boom membership of 501, and falls 140 short of the Quebec club's numerical strength. The Huron district, numerically speaking, is the largest of the fourteen C. W. A. subdivisions, having a membership of 1,602. Niagara with 1,277 is the next, and Toronto with 1,055 third.

The amateur champion of last season, John Davidson, has renounced his intention of turning professional. The Toronto team have 996 active members, which is double that of the A. C. C. and 148 more than the Wanderers. The R. C. B. C. 68, Tourists 65, and Globe 48 comprise the six largest Toronto clubs.
