**PAIN'S FIREWORKS COMPANY**

New York, Dec. 8.—Pain's Fireworks Company, whose headquarters are in this city, made an assignment yesterday. The cause is stated to be principally due to complications arising from an accident occurring at Columbus, Ohio, during a sham battle, resulting in a large number of suits for damages for injuries, as well as from the fire which occurred at the company's factory last summer. Liabilities stated to be about \$7,000, with assets about the same.

**Forward to Ladysmith**

**Indications That Preparations for an Advance Are Completed.**

**Arrival of Generals Buller and Clery at Frere.**

**Two Big Battles Believed to Be Impending.**

**Boer Dispatch Says Fighting Began Near Modder River Tuesday Morning.**

**Cavalry Brigade of 4,000 Men Destined for South Africa.**

**Bodies of Dead Boers in the Modder Made the British Camp Unsanitary.**

**Finished.**

Pretoria, Wednesday, Dec. 6.—Fighting commenced near Modder River at 6 o'clock this morning.

**THE CAMP AT MODDER.**

London, Dec. 8.—While nothing in the latest message from the British camp at the Modder River indicated an immediate advance, it appears that Pretoria has news that fighting was resumed Wednesday. It is not shown, however, whether Gen. Methuen has advanced on the new position taken up by the Boers or has merely engaged in a reconnaissance in force.

Reports were again current at the Orange River Tuesday, Dec. 5, that Mafeking has been relieved. It is known through dispatches from Magal, that preparations were completed there to advance in force Nov. 15, from Rhodesia, for the purpose of repairing the railroad line and restoring communication with Col. Baden-Powell. The Boers, however, were strongly entrenched near Gaberones, midway between Magal and Mafeking.

**GEN. GATACRE REINFORCED.**

Reinforcements are rapidly arriving at Sterkstroom to strengthen Gen. Gatacre, including the much-needed artillery. The authorities expect speedy news that Gen. Gatacre has taken the offensive, thus diverting a portion of the Orange Free State forces now obstructing the advance of Gen. Gatacre.

A detachment of Cape Police had a skirmish with the Boers on Thursday, Dec. 7, near Indwe, while Gen. French reports.

A war office dispatch from Gen. Buller confirms the statement that heliographic communication has been fully established with Ladysmith, and that Gen. Buller and Gen. White had been conferring as to their future movements.

**TWO GREAT BATTLES IMPENDING.**

New York, Dec. 8.—In discussing the present status of the war in the Transvaal, a cable from London to the Tribune says that two great battles are impending at Ladysmith and Kimberley, and the hotspots are impatient to have them come. One leading British journal, impressed with the conviction that the situation of White's army is critical, deprecates delay, and well-nigh raises a cry of "On to Ladysmith!" It has also published evidence of large reinforcements which Gen. Cronje has received from Natal and Mafeking to enable him to make a strong stand at Spytfontein. The war office, however, is satisfied to allow Gen. Buller a free hand. The gravest feature of the situation in Natal is the marked improvement in the artillery practice of the Boer batteries around Ladysmith. While the naval gun had knocked out a big Creusot and a howitzer.

rapidly nearing completion. Gen. Methuen is waiting on this to get the artillery across, when he will be in condition to advance on the last stage to Kimberley. Some naval guns, with light ammunition, are expected here shortly. Methuen has been reinforced by the 12th Lancers, and five field guns have arrived, together with tents and stores. It is expected the rest of the reinforcements will be here in another week.

**DEATH AND FEVER.**

Twelve of the British wounded died yesterday. A few cases of fever have appeared, probably because of the corpses in the river; consequently the camp has been shifted back. The morale of the troops is excellent.

**ALL QUIET AT KIMBERLEY.**

Kimberley, Monday, Dec. 4, via Modder River.—Everything has been quiet here during the last three days. The theater and the convent have been fitted up as hospitals. A number of our cattle have been captured by the enemy.

Modder River, Monday, Dec. 4.—A searchlight message from Col. Kekewich at Kimberley says the town is provisioned for 30 days, with forage for 30 days, and has a plentiful water supply.

**THE SORTIE OF THE 23TH.**

London, Friday, Dec. 8.—A special dispatch from Kimberley, dated Nov. 23, says: As a result of signals from the relief force to the south, and of certain movements on the part of the Boers, Col. Kekewich determined to make a sortie, with the view of keeping a large force of the Boers employed here. Yesterday afternoon a portion of the garrison, with artillery, under Major Chamer, and mounted troops, under Major Scott-Turner, advanced southward toward the Boer position, and captured a number of their cattle. The sortie was intended to hold, in view of Lord Methuen's early approach. Major Scott-Turner then turned his attention to the Boer laager, which he destroyed in fine style, in spite of the enemy's fire. All the camp equipment was captured or destroyed. Finally the British stormed the ridge, and captured three redoubts after severe fighting. In leading the men who were storming the third redoubt, Major Scott-Turner and Lieut. Wright were killed. It is alleged that they were struck by explosive bullets. The death of Major Scott-Turner completed the British to retire upon Carter's farm, the whole affair having lasted four hours.

**THE BOER ADVANCE.**

London, Dec. 7.—The Boer advance in the northern portion of Cape Colony is becoming remarkable. The local farmers are flocking to the Boer laagers, the townspeople in many instances welcoming the invaders with every demonstration of sympathy. The action of British territory proceeds daily. The reported Boer successes have made a great impression among the Basutos.

A dispatch from Worcester River Station says that Gen. Cronje, who is concentrating below Spytfontein, about six miles north of here, has been reinforced by 3,000 Boers.

**FUN FOR THE BESIEGED.**

George W. Stevens, in a dispatch from Ladysmith, dated Dec. 1, informs the Daily Mail that two of the besiegers' big guns are dangerous, and his account of sports and festivities in the camp show that the beleaguered troops are cheerful enough to play cricket, football and polo, to have mule steepchases and hold a championship sculling match on the Klip River between a canvas boat and a rubber bath-tub, to relieve the monotony.

Gen. White, at a banquet of the Gordon Highlanders, at which salmon, haggis, turkey and fruit figured. In a speech Gen. White said it was unpleasant to be bombarded without stirring but everybody had the satisfaction of knowing they were playing the correct game. There is plenty of food, water and ammunition.
