## SOX HELD DOWN TIGHT

Only One Allowed Past the First Base—Summers Touched for But One Hit.

Chicago, July 29.—The most sensational game of ball and the greatest pitching duel ever witnessed at Comiskey Park was played this afternoon between the White Sox and the Tigers and only one of the most brilliant pieces of base running of the year by Ty Cobb allowed the Tigers to score the only run of the game in the seventh inning.

Only once were the White Sox able to reach first base through hitting Eddie Summers safely, and his hit was good for but one base. On two other different occasions did members of Duffy's organization get as far as the initial sack, and these were through passes issued by the Tiger twirler.

"You can't stop the Tigers now," is the sentiment of Chicago fans at present. Their work of the past few days is what has made them look good right here in Chicago. It has been 27 innings since they have been scored on, and this is due to the work of their pitchers, who have come back from the slump that they were in on the eastern trip.

Fitted against Summers Duffy had big Ed Walsh. The "spittin' artist" was working well enough for him to win the game, and had it not been for the great work of Cobb in the seventh inning, the game would probably have ended with the result being a scoreless tie.

The play and after Cobb had started the inning with a clean single to left, his second hit of the day, Crawford fled to first base, and then, seeing there was little chance of him being brought in from first with Walsh pitching the way he was, he decided to try to get the game around the circuit, and he was successful.
