LONDON CHOIR
AT HAMILTON

Methodist Vocalists Scored Another Triumph in the Ambitious City.

PRAISE WAS UNSTINTED

A Very Ambitious Programme, Exceptionally Well Rendered, Said the Critics.

The choir of the First Methodist Church gave a return concert, last evening at the Centenary Church, Hamilton, before a very large and appreciative audience that completely filled the large church.

A special train of three Pullmans, hauled by one of the new mogul engines, carried the choir and their friends, numbering about two hundred, and made a fast run, without any stops.

At Hamilton they were met by Rev. J. V. Smith, Mr. Hewlett and a committee from the Centenary Church, and taken in special cars to the church, where a light lunch was served before the concert by the Ladies' Aid.

The following programme was rendered in an artistic manner. Although on the programme appeared the words, "Please do not applaud," before the concert was fairly started the audience seized away by the volume, attack and enunciation of the First Church's great choir, which excelled itself.

As a speaker at the banquet, said: "That chorus, 'The Wilderness,' by Samuel Sebastian Wesley, was one of the best we have heard for years."

"The Cherubim Song," by Tschalkovsky, from the Church Russian, a very difficult anthem, unaccompanied and seldom attempted by an amateur choir, elicited very favorable comments from the critical audience.

In "Shew Me Thy Ways" (Torre), also the obligato solo, "In Heavenly Love" (Grieg), was very fine, and received a well deserved encore.

Mr. Jordan's numbers, especially "The Carnival," by Dvorak, were rendered in a manner that was well received.

After the concert a banquet was provided, at which speeches were given by Rev. J. V. Smith, Mr. W. H. Hewlett and others, on behalf of the Centenary choir, and responded to by Mr. A. D. Jordan, Dr. Eccles, Rev. R. Whiting, Mr. George McCormick, Mr. J. E. Macgregor, and others, on behalf of the London choir. A fine time was enjoyed by all. The singers arrived home at an early hour this morning.

Comments by Critics.

Mr. Thomas G. Mitchell: "A very fine programme extraordinarily well rendered. The shading, the attack and enunciation were simply perfect, and showed very careful training. The best chorus singing I have heard in years."

Mr. W. H. Hewlett: "A very ambitious programme, very seldom attempted by an amateur choir, very well rendered. Hope that we will be able to have the privilege of exchanging courtesies in the near future."
