They are models of beauty, from Barney & Smith, and contain many improvements over colonist sleepers now in use. Each car has fourteen sections, with gentlemen's toilet rooms in one end is the Baker fire-proof heater, which heats the car by means of hot water, conducted through pipes. In the opposite end is a wrought-iron range, surrounded by good kitchen facilities. The car is finished in ash, maple and butternut, beautifully polished. The sections are divided by sliding thead-boards, effecting a privacy not possible in those now in use, where sections are separated by wire netting.
