JAPANESE EXPECTED TO CROSS THE YALU SOON

London, April 25.—(Special Cable.)—The London Chronicle has received the following despatch from its correspondent at Seoul:

It is believed that important engagements are in progress along the Yalu river, but so far the Japanese censors have not permitted any of the details to reach the outside world.
