

NOTICE LEGAL POINTS

Considered by the Judge at Osgoode Hall Yesterday. A motion was made to the master in chambers yesterday for particulars of the statement of claim in the action of Lebaron B. Campbell against the City of Toronto.

The motion for a railway carrier's interest order made by the Grand Trunk Railway Company came up again yesterday before the master in chambers, but was enlarged till Tuesday next.

The case of Attorney-General against the Vaughan Road Company is still on an injunction to restrain the defendants from collecting tolls on their road came up before Mr. Justice Falconbridge, who enlarged it before the Common Pleas Divisional Court.

Mr. Justice Street made an order for the issue of a writ of certiorari to bring up the conviction in the case of the Queen v. Westlake, Westlake, a builder of Whitby, bargained with the proprietor of the Royal Hotel one morning for the contents of his bar till that day for \$25.

The Queen's Bench Divisional Court yesterday dismissed the appeal in the case of Constantine v. Gills in the judgment of Mr. Justice Macdonald.

The chancellor yesterday finished the case of Messrs. J. McShane and gave judgment in favor of the plaintiff, setting aside the agreement to sell the Ottawa Mass. land in the plaintiff. She is to pay the defendant \$1000 in two payments of \$500 each.
