Hog Cholera Commandments Dr. A. H. Logan, veterinary field
agent for the United States Departnent o Agricaliure, who is stationed
at the University of Florida, has prepared ten commandments for the
control of hog cholera:

1. Through tee days of thy labors quire special attention in feeding
drinki drinkking, housing and general cleanli-
ness.
2. Thou shalt keep over thy flook of swine lesti a portion 3. Knowest thou that cholera
infection being of easy distribufion by rodents of the field, birds of the air and human agencies, it behooves
the master of the farm, his attendants
and their wives and ehildren to pursue and their wives and ehildren to pursue
and slay, yea, even to destroy pigg eons, slay, yous, , even to destrards, stray dogs and
other animals that go from farm to farm; for the same reason thou
shouldst not permit in vist shouldst not permit in visitation
upon ty sy swine hatitat strangers,
such as pedders, agents and buyere such as peddlers, agents and buyers;
nay, not even neighors, lest they
introduce cholera and introduce oholera and
destruction of thy herd.
3. Watch thy
thine Watco thy neighbor's herd as thine own, for often cholera hath
stricken his herd and he remaineth
silent.
4. Should it come to pass that
the scourge, eholera, infect thy herd the scourge, oholorat, infect thy herd,
isolate the afflicted from the well,
