OTTAWA, Aug. 30. Reports of ex-Speaker Cockburn's condition are not encouraging, and fears are entertained that he may not recover.

Ex-Governor Letellier is dying at River Ouelle. His confessor, Rev. E. Dion was telegraphed to in Quebec and left Friday by Intercolonial.

BRIDGEPORT, CONN., Aug. 30. An excursion train from Down on the Housatonic Railroad was run down by express freight train near Parlor Rock, this afternoon. Both engineers are fatally injured. A special train has just left here for scene of the disaster. Reported several killed. No particulars received here yet.

DETROIT, Mich., Aug. 31. There is but little news from the wreck of the "Marine City." She has floated ashore, but burned to the water's edge. Latest statements are that books and papers have been lost, so that the work of ascertaining how many have perished will be difficult. It is estimated there were 120 passengers and a crew of 40 on board. 130 have been saved but the rest it is feared are lost. Three bodies have been recovered.

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. Last evening John Doman was fatally stabbed in Brooklyn by James Morgan who has been arrested.

LONDON, Aug. 30. General Roberts in a message to Lord Hartington states that he arrived at Rholat (Ghizai) on the 23rd, had abundant supplies and could make forage last till Sept. 1st. Would rest on the 24th and start on the 25th and hoped to telegraph from Candahar on the 29th. Roberts left Ghuznee on the 6th and marched 136 miles in 8 days. His march has been unopposed; had obtained plenty supplies and forage. Cavalry and artillery horses in good condition.

PARIS, Aug. 30. Since the beginning of the year there have been 140 duels fought in France.
