





Municipality of Annapolis: Gentlemen-Your committee to report on the revision of registration of ear marks for sheep and cattle beg to make the following recommendation. We would recommend that the division of the county be as formerly viz the Townships of Wilmot, Granville, Annapolis and Clements, and that one Registrar be appointed for each division. That each registrar on or before the 31st day of December of each and every year file with the County Clerk a copy of all registration made during that year. We would also recommend the Municipality provide suitable books for keeping the ecords and determing the registrar's fees. We would recommend a fee of 50 cents for all new registration and 25 cents for transfers.
