remaining 20%, the vast majority have three to one hundred employees, since less than one percent have over 100.

Most sports and recreational goods are distributed by a small group of companies. Among these, Indemar and El Tigre del Centro are the most significant. The largest sports equipment retailer in Mexico is Grupo Martí, which, with eleven stores throughout Mexico, is estimated to hold approximately 70% of the sports equipment market in the country. Major department stores control another 15%, while the remaining 15% consists of small independent retailers with small stores throughout the country's major cities. In Mexico City, for example, roughly 20 sports equipment stores are located downtown along Venustiano Carranza street.

Commercial establishments are grouped in several chambers and associations, the most important of which are the National Chambers of Commerce, all associated to the Confederation of National Chambers of Commerce (Concanaco),
