PRAYERS.

Mr. Speaker informed the House,—That the Clerk had laid on the Table the Eleventh Report of the Examiner of Petitions, which was read as follows:—

Pursuant to Rule 96, Section 2, the Examiner of Petitions for Private Bills has the honour to present the following as his Eleventh Report.

Your Examiner has duly examined the following Petitions for Private Bills and finds that all the requirements of the 91st Rule have been complied with in each case, viz.:—

Of the Quebec Rapid Transit Railway Company, for an Act to extend the time for the construction of their authorized works.

Of Anna Mabel Ferguson, for an Act to dissolve her marriage with George Henry Ferguson, her husband, and that she be divorced from him.

Of James Frederick Neild, for an Act to dissolve his marriage with Everline Gertrude Neild, his wife, and that he be divorced from her.

Of Herbert John Lawrence, for an Act to dissolve his marriage with Jessie Lawrence, his wife, and that he be divorced from her.

Of Gertrude Slater, for an Act to dissolve her marriage with John Slater, her husband, and that she be divorced from him.

Mr. Maclean (Halifax), a Member of the King's Privy Council, for Sir George Foster, laid before the House,—Reports, Returns and Statistics of the Food and Drug Laboratories of the Department of Trade and Commerce, for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1919.

And also,—Final Report of the Fuel Controller, from the establishment of the office in June, 1917, to March, 1919.

Mr. Burrell, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 22nd May, 1919, for a Return showing:—

1. Whether any orders for the purchase of fish for shipment overseas were placed with any companies in Canada by the Canadian Government, or any department thereof, or the War Purchasing Commission, in the years 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919.

2. If so, what the names of the companies are, and the value of the orders placed with each.
