Where the Board has certified a bargaining authority for employees in a unit and no collective agreement is in force:— (a) the bargaining authority may by notice require the employer to commence collective bargaining; or</p>	<p>60. (1) <i>The bargaining agent representing the employees or the unit or classification of employees duly certified in accordance with the provisions of section 59 may serve upon the employer or employers a notice of a meeting to be held for the purpose of collective bargaining. (2) The notice shall be served upon the employer or employers at least three clear days before the time of the meeting and the employer or employers or his or their duly accredited representatives shall attend such meeting for the purpose of bargaining with the representatives of the employees. (3) Such service may be effected by personal service or by mailing the notice by registered post and the date of mailing the notice shall be deemed to be the date of service.</i></p>		<p>10. (1) <i>When bargaining representatives have been certified under this Act they may give the employer concerned, or the employer concerned may give the bargaining representatives, ten clear days' notice requiring that he or they, as the case may be, enter into negotiations with a view to the completion of a collective agreement. (2) The parties shall negotiate in good faith with one another and make every reasonable effort to conclude a collective agreement. (3) At the request of the bargaining representatives they may be accompanied during the negotiations by officers or agents of the trade union or employees' organization concerned.</i></p>
