He praises with enthusiastic tone All centuries but this, and every country but his own.

Mr. Fleming: Sing it.

Mr. Winters: The hon. member for New Westminster suggested that we do everything we can to find ways of building better and cheaper houses. With that I am fully in accord. We have already set up committees to study that particular problem and are in the process now of establishing an advisory committee of citizens from across the whole country, who will give us the benefit of their advice based on local conditions, in an endeavour to use Canadian materials and resources to the best advantage in building cheaper houses and better houses, having in mind as well the very serious fire problem that he raised.

I wish to thank the hon. member for Hamilton South and the hon. member for Vancouver South for the very splendid and constructive contributions they made to the debate.
