AWARD OF MERIT, POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT

Question No. 1,452-Mr. MacDonald (Egmont):

With reference to the Merit Awards mentioned in answer to Question Number 993 and received by Messrs. F. Mills, J. Frey, E. Parama and P. Hutch-ison, in each of these instances, what was the contribution or significant and imaginative proposal advanced by each of these individuals qualifying them for the award that they subsequently received and what was the amount of the award in each case?

Hon. Eric W. Kierans (Postmaster General and Minister of Communications): Mr. Mills recommended a way of reducing the work load of the Records Management Section of Headquarters. He received an award of \$500. Mr. Frey invented a more secure and versatile lock for street letter boxes. He received an award of \$1,500. Mr. Parama introduced the concept of preventative maintenance and critical path planning to the maintenance of equipment at the Edmonton Post Office. He received an award of \$1,000. It was largely through Mr. Hitchison's efforts that the number of injuries to Departmental employees at the Toronto Post Office was reduced when staff was increased. His application of energy and sense of purpose resulted in improved morale and increased participation. He received an award of \$750.
