By Mr. Skey:—1. What sub-contracts have been issued on the Ford Hotel project in Montreal?

2. To whom have they been issued?

3. For what work?

4. At what prices?

Mr. McCann, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order forthwith.

By Mr. Fulton:—1. Does the Federal Government own any building at Williams Lake? If so, what are the particulars and value?

2. Does the Federal Government rent any building or buildings at Williams Lake? If so, what are the particulars?

3. What departments, branches, or agencies of the Federal Government have permanent office space in Williams Lake, or require intermittent accommodation there in connection with the public service?

4. What is the total annual building rental paid in Williams Lake by the Federal Government?

By Mr. Green:—What amounts by way of direct taxes have been collected annually during the last fifteen years on (a) tobacco; (b) cigarette papers; (c) jewellery; (d) cosmetics; (e) railway tickets; (f) steamship tickets; (g) railway berths; (h) steamship berths?

By Mr. Castleden for Mr. Nicholson:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all letters, telegrams and other documents in connection with negotiations between Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and the city of Toronto and the Province of Ontario, in 1946-47-48, in connection with the grant for \$1,150,000 to assist in slum clearance in the city of Toronto.

By Mr. Castleden for Mr. Nicholson:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all letters and telegrams exchanged between Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and the city of Windsor during 1948-49 in connection with the construction of an additional five hundred houses in Windsor.

Mr. Garson moved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole this day, to consider the following proposed Resolution, viz:—

That it is expedient to present a bill to amend The Judges Act, 1946, to authorize the Governor in Council to increase the number of judges of the Superior Court of the Province of Quebec by not more than six judges.
