December Seventh 1921. M. A. Jull, Esq., M.Sc., Macdonald College, que. Dear Mr. Jull:-I have your letter of December 2nd and should have answered it before. I have spoken to several of my friends, Mr. A.J. Brown, Mr. J.W. Ross and others, who are Governors of the University, and they would like very much to have eggs sent in from Macdonald College. Will you please send me a shipment of 30 dozen and charge the amount to me. I shall I know be able to dispose of them for the price plus the 2 cents extra for express charges. I think you had better arrange to send me the 30 dozen each week during the winter. As soon as I know just who are taking the eggs I shall give you their names and the amounts so that they may settlem their own accounts, but until I know just who they are, I would ask that they all be sent to me. I hope that you are already making plans for increasing your output for commercial purposes. I do not suggest that you go into the business for making money, but I believe that yours is a Department which should pay for its own up-keep. The constant and increasing deficits in the several departments at Macdonald College are a matter of concern, and anything that we can do to wipe out
