38. All Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Senate, from Bye-laws and time to time, in relation to any of the matters hereinbefore mentioned, shall be submitted to, and approved by the Governor in Council, as hereinbefore provided.

39. This Act shall be construed, and adjudged, in the most of this Act. favorable and beneficial sense for the University, as well in the

Provincial Courts of Law and Equity, as elsewhere.

40. The Senate shall annually report to the Governor in Report by Council, at such time as he shall appoint, upon the transactions of the University during the year preceding such report, and upon the general state and prospects of the same, and such other particulars as such Senate shall deem proper, or as the Governor in Council shall require; the Senate shall also, whenever required so to do, by the Governor in Council, report specially upon any matters or subjects connected with the University; and every such annual or special report, shall be laid before the Legislature of Nova Scotia at its then, or next ensuing Session.

41. A sum not exceeding two thousand dollars shall be Expenses of or placed at the disposal of the Senate of the University, to meet fee. the expenses incidental to the organization of the University, and its operations during the first years of its existence, and a like sum in each succeeding year. No portion of such sum shall be expended, without the approval of the Governor in

Council for the purpose first had and obtained.

42. This Act may be cited as "The University Act, 1876." Act—how to be cited.
