My LORD,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Lordship's despatch, No. 89 of the 20th of April, forwarding a Petition to the Queen received from the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebcc, and signed by a large number of the Roman Catholic Clergy and laity of that Diocese, praying for the intervention of Her Majesty's Government with a view to the restoration of the temporal sovereignty of the Pope.

I request that you will inform the Archbishop that this Petition has been laid before the Queen who was pleased to receive it very graciously. Several memorials of a similar character have lately been received by Her Majesty, and as the most convenient mode of answering the present Petition, I enclose a copy of a despatch which was addressed to the Governor of Malta, in reply to a memorial from the inhabitants of Malta and Gozo.
