### FRANK BOGASH JR. WINS "BLUE GRASS"

Flower Direct Takes the Cumberland, the Second Stake at Lexington.

LEXINGTON, Oct. 16.—Two stakes were contested for today in the Grand Circuit meeting, the Cumberland, for 1 1/2 pacers, and the Blue Grass, for 2 1/2 pacers.

Flower Direct won the former after losing the first heat to Walter Cochato. In the third heat Longworth B. broke badly and collided with Walter Cochato. The gelding was distanced but was al-

lowed to start in the next heat because of the accident. Frank Bogash Jr. won the Blue Grass Stake in straight heats from Del Rey and Herman Wagner, the latter being distanced in the final heat. The 2.15 trot resulted in a straight heat victory for Bright Asworth, closely pushed by Morine in the first and second heats and by Berka in the third.
