

And every Student at matriculation shall sign a declaration to this effect:

I, A. B. whilst a student of St. John's College shall willingly obey the statutes and Rules of the College.

19. In these Statutes, St. John's College shall include any school attached to it, and the term "Students" shall include all pupils of the same.

Given under Our hand and seal at Bishop's Court, Manitoba, this second day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the Eleventh year of Our Consecration.

The following additional statutes were sanctioned by the Executive Committee of the Synod in 1884:

20. The College Board may recommend to the Council for the title of Associate in Arts such students of St. John's College or St. John's College School as pass such examination, as the Board with the approval of the Council may appoint for this purpose, or regard as equivalent, or such students of St. John's College, St. John's College School, and the Red River Academy under Mr. Macallum and Bishop Anderson, or have distinguished themselves in any profession or line of business in after life.

The Council may if it see fit, on receiving such recommendation grant the title by resolution or grace and may further in special cases declare an Associate in Arts eligible as a member of the Senate.

21. The following shall be eligible as members of the Senate, and shall be members of the Senate provided their names are kept on the Boards of the College:

- (a) The Members of the Council
- (b) The Honorary Fellows of the College
- (c) The Professors of the College
- (d) The Theological and other graduate Members of the College
- (e) Associates in Arts of the College specially declared to be eligible as Members of the Senate.

The Members of the Council, the Honorary Fellows of the College, and the Professors of the College shall have their names on the Boards of the College while they hold their positions in the College.

Any other person eligible as a Member of the Senate shall be entitled to have his name entered on the Boards of the College for life on the payment of fifteen dollars or for one year from the date of payment of one dollar. Such life and annual payments may at any time be changed after a notice of one year. These payments whether life or annual shall not prevent the charge of an additional fee, or the requiring of the lodging of a sum of money as caution money for the use of any library, museum, laboratory or other privilege involving cost to the College.

The Members of Senate who are of the full age of 21 years, shall elect four out of their number who shall be members of the Council of the College as hereinafter set forth. The election shall be by voting papers
