Note For THE TEACHER.—Before commencing this book, the pupil is supposed to have some knowledge of Numeration, to be acquainted with the Multiplication Table, and to be able to work easy exercises in Simple Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Short Division. As an introduction to the following exercises the Author uses the First Book of Arithmetic, published in Nelson's School Series—a little work which he would unhesitatingly recommend, especially to teachers of the Deaf and Dumb. For beauty and clearness of typography, ingenious arrangement, careful gradation of difficulties and fulness of exercises, he knows nothing of equal value. Indeed, had it been prepared expressly for the purpose, it could scareely have been better adapted to the requirements of Deafmute tuition.
