

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may he mestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskaichewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon steader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 90 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, sen, daughter, brother or sister.
