SALT LAKE, Utah, March 27.—Jas. Jack, treasurer of Utah for twenty years, and treasurer of the Mormon Church for more than fifty years, died at his home here to-day. He was 82 years old.

Jack crossed the plains with an ox team in the early fifties. Shortly after reaching Salt Lake City he was appointed by Brigham Young, as treasurer of the church. He served in this office under all Mr. Young's successors.
