

WON'T TAKE HOARDED GOLD.

New York, Nov. 5.—The sub-Treasury is still refusing to take deposits of hoarded gold, as the working force is engaged in counting silver deposits which accumulated uncounted in the week preceding the election. Recent hoarders of gold are showing anxiety to get rid of the metal in exchange for greenbacks. Banks to-day reported the receipt of large amounts. In every case, so far as the National and State banks are concerned, the gold was taken on deposit only, and greenbacks for it were refused, even to old depositors.
