New York Gossip. Henry A. King & Co., 12 King-street east, ecceived the following despatch to-day from New York:

The market opened a little higher on The market opened a little higher on London buying and strength in specialties. In the early dealings, there was readizing through the active list, especially in St. Paul, and a sharp attack was made en Sugar, which broke the price materially. This led to general weakness in the afterneon, which was increased by an advance in call money to 4 per cent. In the 'ast hour the whole market declined on moderate dealings, and closed heavy about the lowest for the day, with fair net declines.

Smellie & Shaw, solicitors for the Furniture Association, have preferred a charge of forgery against Lorigan. A statement was made a short time before the failure showing assets \$28,800, and liabilities of \$5000. After the assignment the liabilities amounted to \$20,000, with very little assets. In the statement he filed claims of \$8000 on men who were said to be in his employ. The notes were then discounted by the Molsons Bank. Negotiations were made for a settlement of the notes, which failed, and a charge of forgery was laid, but Mr. Lorigan was not to be found. He is at present thought to be in the United States. The Molsons Bank are interested to the extent of \$11,881.
