

WILL MAKE A GREAT ONE

Deep Work Has Been Planned on the Rambler-Cariboo Group by a New Company

TO BE FORMED UNDER OUR LAWS

The Capital Will Be Increased When the Mine Will Make a Dividend-Payer.

The Rambler & Cariboo Consolidated Gold & Silver Mining Company, owning the Rambler-Cariboo group in the Siyeh, is to be reincorporated under the laws of British Columbia as the Rambler-Cariboo Mining Company. The capital stock of the corporation is to be increased to \$2,500,000, of which \$1,000,000 is to be paid up. The increase in the capital stock is to be made by the issue of new shares, the proceeds of which are to be devoted to making the Rambler-Cariboo mine a dividend-paying property.

This action was decided upon at a meeting of the Board of Directors held in Spokane on June 14. A special meeting of the stockholders will be held in Spokane on Saturday, July 15, for the purpose of approving the action of the directors.

There is no doubt but what this approval will be given, the controlling interest in the property being already pledged to it. The proposition to incorporate with a sufficient increase in stock to provide a treasury fund of \$2,500,000 shares, and upon consideration of some time, and there was no opposition to it when it was proposed at the meeting.
