

This action was decided upon at a meeting of the Board of Directors held in Spotane on June 14. A special meeting of nees tockholders will be held in Spotane an Saturday, July 16, for the purpose of upproving the action of the directors. There is no doubt but what this approval will be given, the controlling interest in the property being already piedged to it. The proposition to reincorporate with a mincient increase in atock to provide a reasury fund of 250,000 shares has been inder consideration for some time, and here was no opposition to it when it was roposed at the meeting. The mine is at resent upon a basis where it is more than anyling all expenses of operation, but it is desired to explore the ore bodies at such greater depth than now obtained, and iso to open up the veins at other points. To do this extensive development a large mount of money will be required and it is thought advisable to raise this by an interesse in treasury stock.

The labor troubles in the Slocan have not caused the shut-down of the Rambler-Cariboo, although it has been found necessary for the present to abandon stoping out ore in the upper works. The long crosscut tudnet, which is being driven to tap the ore bodies at a point far below the present workings, is still being pushed ahead, six men being worked in it. This tunnel will be driven ahead without cessation until it makes connections with the witze which is being sunk from the No. 2 tunnel. When this connection is made, which will not be until about Sept. 1, the permanent value of the mine will have been determined and it will be possible to take out ore at a third less than the present cost. The work in the tunnel is not proceeding very rapidly at present, but a three-drill compressor has been ordered and will be installed early in August. With this working, rapid progress will be made.

No shipments are now being made from the mine, because of the bad roads in the Slocan. The ore on the dump is valued at about \$5000. This will be shipped as soon as the roads will permit and probably it will be the only ore shipped until the competition of the long tunnel, when a great saving can be made in the cost of taking out ore, and it will be possible to ship at much more profit.
