#### BRICGE TO VANCOUVER

British Columbia Engineer Wants to Join the Island and Mainland.

Ottawa, Dec. 5.-H. P. Bell, a British

Columbia engineer, has just prepared a report for the department of railways and canals in Ottawa on the feastbility and cost of building a bridge from the mainland to Vancouver Island. Bell calculates that such a bridge would cost at least \$35,000,000, and says the work would be of a formidable character.
