SAVOY THEATRE BURNS AT LOSS OF \$30,000

Early Morning Blaze in Business District—The Grocers Have a Great Time.

HAMILTON, Sept. 1.—(Special.)—Fire early this morning swept the interior of the Savoy Theatre, on Merrick-street, doing damage estimated at \$30,000, and gave the city officials an anxious hour, as it was feared that the heavy strain on the waterworks pumps in their crippled capacity would cause them to break down, cutting off the water supply. The speed with which the blaze was checked doubtless prevented a disaster, as the theatre is in the heart of Hamilton's business district. A lighted cigar butt or a defective electric wire is assigned as the cause of the fire, which had probably been burning for hours before it was discovered.

Although the damage is covered by insurance, the fire is a heavy loss to the owners, as it will take the best part of the season to rebuild. The theatre would likely have played Schubert attractions this season. It had been running as a moving picture house.
