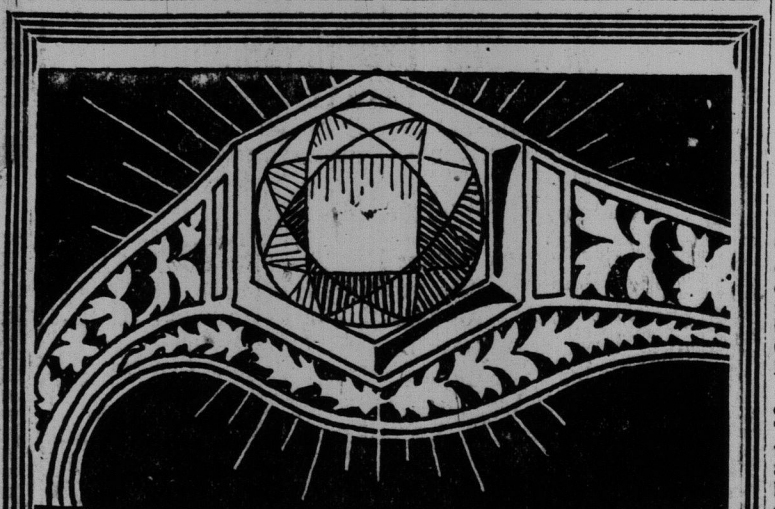
RAILWAY TOWN TO BE REPRESENTED

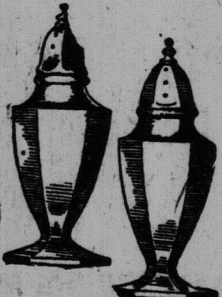

LANDS AND MINES REVENUE LESS

N. B. Department Report Shows Total of \$1,118,798

Stampage Decline is \$198,000—Detailed List of Payments Given

FREDERICTON, March 11.—The net revenue of the province of New Brunswick from the Department of Lands and Mines for the fiscal year ending Oct. 31, 1925, showed a falling off of more than \$200,000 from the preceding year, according to the report of the department tabled in the Legislative Assembly this afternoon by Hon. C. D. Richards, Minister of Lands and Mines.

The net revenue was \$1,118,798.35 as compared with \$1,322,891.38 for 1924. The biggest decrease was in stumpage, which showed a falling off of about \$198,000. Timber bonuses showed a big increase, being more than \$67,000 ahead of those of the previous year.

The Bathurst Co., Ltd., was the heaviest contributor in stumpage fees with \$85,909. The Richards Manufacturing Company was second with \$57,022 with the Fraser Company third with \$50,096.
