NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—Bank of England rate unchanged at 4 per cent. Continental Oil declared regular quarterly dividend of 25 cents. Carloadings week ended Oct. 24 were 1,121,459, against 1,086,114 in preceding week and 1,113,053 corresponding week last year. Shell Union Oil in quarter ended Oct. 30 earned 78 cents against 68 cents in preceding quarter and 67 cents same quarter last year. Colombe Fuel quarter ended Sept. 30 deficit \$188,284 after interest, tax, depreciation, etc., against surplus of \$884,177 in preceding quarter and deficit of \$259,788 same quarter 1924. **Rile Quebec Papers**  
MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—The French language press of Quebec continues to manifest indignation over the comments of certain English journals with regard to the outcome of the election in this province. In general, the English language press deplored the apparent tightening of the tension between Quebec and Ontario, claiming that this was indicated in Quebec voting almost solidly Liberal and Ontario voting almost solidly Conservative. One English newspaper declared that, notwithstanding her Liberty vote, "Quebec had been saved in spite of herself."
