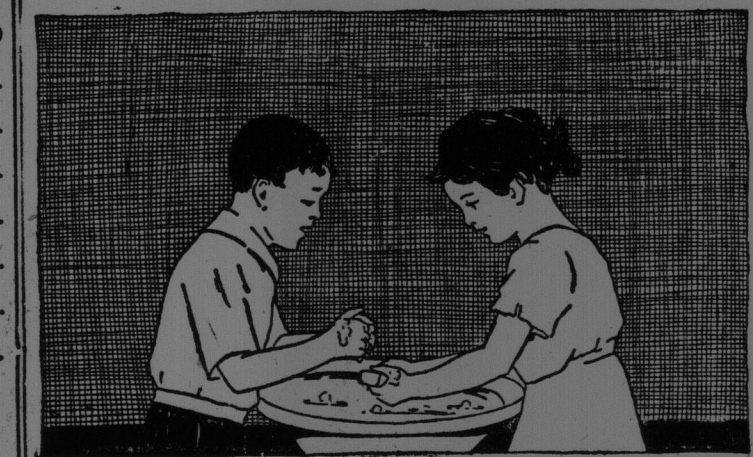

## CROWDED BUS HITS FREIGHT

One Dead, One Dying, Toll of Accident in a Quebec Town—Tragedy Unexplained.

Quebec, Oct. 6.—While twenty men, women and children screamed hysterically, an auto bus, owned by the Dominion Cartage Company, crashed into the rear car of a freight train at Charlebois, at about seven o'clock on Tuesday evening, killing Antoine Bedard, fifteen, a school girl who was

returning home. A Miss Breton, who sat next to the child, sustained such severe injuries that she is not expected to live.

Whether the driver lost control of his car, or whether the brakes failed at the crucial moment has not yet been explained. The train, a long one, had almost cleared the crossing, and passengers thought the auto bus was slowing up, when suddenly it crashed into the rear car of the train. The motor car was razed, the right side being completely torn away from the body.

The dead girl, who sat at the front of the bus, was horribly mangled, and died of internal hemorrhages shortly afterward.
