Washington, March 22—The four-power arrangement was assailed by Senator La Follette as a scheme of Great Britain and Japan to secure cooperation and protection of the U. S. "in their further schemes of exploitation and imperialism," in a speech today on the resumption of the treaty debate in the senate. He declared it was viewed by both British and Japanese statesmen as merely an extension of the Anglo-Japanese alliance which it abrogates, and that in actual practice it would result in binding the United States to support the policies of London and Tokio against such outside powers as China, Russie and Germany.
