STAGE SUCCESS USED
BY NAZIMOVA MONDAY

"Out of the Fog," the latest masterpiece in which Nazimova the distinguished Russian actress, is the heroine, which will have a special showing at the Imperial theatre on Monday and Tuesday next, has been adapted for the screen from her greatest stage success, "Ception Shoals," a powerful drama of the sea, written by H. Rustin Adams. This play, which was produced at the Thirty-ninth Street Theatre, New York, and which ran for two seasons, created world-wide comment, both for its unusual and elemental theme and for the supreme artistry of Nazimova's characterizations. In "Out of the Fog," Nazimova has carried out with faithful exactness the story which is even more convincing in picture form than it was in the more restricted confines of the stage.

TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL

President F. A. Campbell presided at a meeting of the Trades and Labor Council last night when a committee was appointed to act jointly with one from the Board of Trade and the City Council with regard to street paving, reported that the joint committee was in favor of the abutting paying 50 per cent. of the cost. The council instructed the committee to support the plan of paving for the work by general assessment. Delegate Saurin was appointed a representative of the board upon the juvenile court committee. W. H. Conits of the Typographical Union, was selected representative upon the Board of Film Censors appointed by the provincial government. Invitations to labor movement were sent to Mrs. Rose Henderson and to Tom Moore.

The steel strike in the United States was discussed and the support of the council was offered. A communication from Mayor Hayes set out that Mr. O'Connor will be in the city soon to take up his investigation regarding the high cost of living. It was decided to appoint a committee from the council to assist the local musicians in every way possible. A resolution was adopted protesting against the appointment of alien musicians to fill the positions made vacant by a lock-out. With reference to the number of school age children employed in various factories and other places of business in the province, a committee was named to appeal to Premier Foster to the provincial factory law thoroughly enforced.

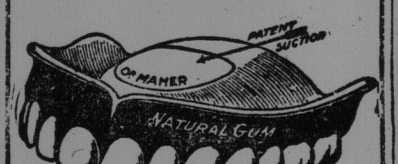

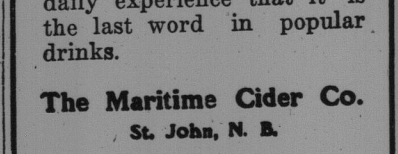
