The Great War Veterans held a monthly meeting last evening, opening the drive for increased membership at the Imperial theatre. Canon G. A. Kuhring acted as chairman, as Major MacLean, president, and Major C. H. MacLean, chairman of the membership committee, were unavoidably absent. The speakers were Lieut.-Colonel W. R. Brown, D.O., late O. C. of the 26th; Lieut.-Colonel C. W. MacLean, C.M.G., B.S. (M. P. for Brigs, Lancashire, England) and Hon. R. J. Ritchie.
