### GETS AWAY AGAIN

**Toothache Helped Escape of Man Charged With \$50,000 Theft**

Berlin, Oct. 10.—The Düsseldorf police are dismayed at the renewed flight of a celebrated embezzler, Heinrich Geb, who eluded two wardens appointed to guard him during a visit to the dentist. It was discovered last year that Geb had defrauded his employers, a large building firm, to the extent of \$80,000, but he managed to escape before a warrant could be issued. The offer of a reward of \$2,500 finally resulted in the discovery that Geb was living in Turkey, with his wife and son, the latter fifteen years old, he had fled to Constantinople, where he had simultaneously arranged to purchase a marble villa on the island of Prinkipo, where he was subsequently arrested.

Geb and his family had embraced Mohammedanism, and it was expected that this move would render extradition impossible, but the German foreign office managed to surmount the difficulty, and Geb was brought back to Germany. He showed exemplary conduct, and as the trial was expected to be held soon, special leave was given him to receive private treatment for a severe attack of toothache. On the way to the dentist's Geb easily slipped his guard, and outdistanced the wardens.
