STOP THE ADDRESSING.
 At the late meeting of the Employees
 Association the determination was re-
 affirmed to stop the addressing of the
 laborer.

When the laborer is the Hampton and
 Prime duty of the laborer is to
 save his life and fortune to main-
 tain the freedom of his country against
 the despotic encroachments of the stran-
 gler, that monarch determined to stop
 this aggression. During the last of
 slavery in the South, more of the slaves
 were anxious to gain their freedom, but
 their masters determined to stop their
 aggression. In both cases this at-
 tempt to stop the aggression led to the
 most disastrous results. In both cases
 freedom came out of the struggle tri-
 umphant, but only after the calamity of
 a deadly struggle.

Labor today is oppressed and it is
 spoiled. So long as the laborer does not
 receive his own, so long as the spoliation
 continues, just so long will there be the
 effort of the downtrodden to assert his
 right to secure his rights. In all the discus-
 sions, so far as we have seen them re-
 ported, there has not been the first hint
 of rights, or the idea that there is any
 injustice of which the laborer has any
 right to complain.

In what way is organized labor show-
 ing its aggression? Is it demanding
 more than it produces? Not by any
 means. Look at any city and ask the
 question: Whence come the goods, the
 houses, the furniture, the machinery, the
 tools that must be the answer? Labor, and
 nothing but labor. Of course, this
 means labor of all kinds, that of the or-
 ganizer as well as that of the manual
 laborer. Do the laborers get half their
 goods? Do they own half of them? It
 is impossible to estimate the share that
 the producer receives of his product, but
 we are quite sure in asserting that he
 gets but a fraction of his just dues.

It is not the language of the employers
 rather remarkable when they imply that
 the laborer is an aggressor? Who is
 the real aggressor, the man who aims
 to establish justice, who strives to secure
 his rights, or the man who seeks to gain
 an advantage over his fellow? The
 laborer is striving simply to secure his
 own. His methods, may not always be
 the wisest, but his aim is right, and
 correct would be to be his duty for the
 triumph of justice. The real aggressor is
 the man who comes to industry and de-
 mands something for nothing, the specu-
 lator who seeks a living at the expense
 of business. While the laborer toils to
 earn a day's support for the members of
 the country, an Astor or a Westminster
 does nothing but subject industry to non-
 sense tributes. Year after year he
 makes a greater and greater demand
 from industry, his aggression is con-
 tinually increasing, placing business un-
 der a greater and greater obligation.
 That is veritable aggression, pure and
 unadulterated. But against that aggression
 the Employers' Association is as
 silent as an assembly of cypresses.

Against the aggression that often
 drives business into bankruptcy, the
 employer utters no protest, he makes no
 complaint; but against those whose toil
 builds up their fortunes, they are heaped
 to suppress and to thwart their struggle
 to secure their rights.

PROTECTION AND RENTS.
 The July issue of The Canadian Single
 Taxer contains an article under the head-
 ing, "Housing from the Creator turned
 into a Curse." Briefly this article shows
 that for the purpose of grasping the
 fat hog, the mine-owners, the Canadian
 Government imposes a duty on imported
 coal of 53 cents a ton. On the yearly
 importation of about four million tons
 the Canadian consumer pays about two
 millions of dollars duty.

Canada mines some 3,400,000 tons a
 year, two million tons of this is bought
 by the Canadian on which we are taxed
 to the tune of another million dollars a
 year, excess price made possible by the
 duty.
 The writer contends, and rightly, if
 the Creator had not put coal deposits in
 the Canadian land, coal would today be as
 the free land and the Canadian people
 could procure the same fuel at \$3,000,
 000 a year less outlay.
 What all the above is to say, the matter
 of present vital interest is the fact that
 the \$2,000,000 yearly collected in duties
 on coal, together with all other import
 duties, is just that much added to the
 "land spoliator." When we understand
