THE SHAMROCK III.

GOUROCK, Scotland, March 31.—Sir Thomas Lipton, in an interview after the trial of the challenger, said he considered that he had every reason for the utmost gratification at the result. Shamrock III, had done all that could be asked of her. He thought the trial proved her to be undoubtedly the best of the America's cup chillengers. In his opinion she was the fastest boat affoat in today's weather, and he looked hopefully to see her do equally well in heavier weather.

D. F. D. Neill, a leading Clyde amateur yachtsman, who was the only outsider on board Shamrock I. all day, said he was satisfied that she was sailed in an honest endeavor to secure the utmost of which she was capable and she was honestly beaten. In windward work, he added. Shamrock III, completely circled Shamrock III, but while he considered the challenger s wonderful boat he did not expect to find so much difference between the two racers in heavier weather as was shown today.

LONDON, April 1.—The Times report of Shamrock III.'s trial yesterday says it was all light weather sailing at a pace scarcely sufficient to cover the America's cup course within the specified time, but that under these conditions the Shamrock III, is undoubtedly much faster than Shamrock II, on almost every point of sailing.
