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MARINE NOTES OF THE WORLD

TUGS TOW VESSELS FROM BAY TO SAFETY

Schooner Launched—Ferry Steamer Leaking—Digby Shipping—Dangers to Navigation.

STEAMER RAISED.
City Island, July 10.—Steamboat John P. Wilson, which sank alongside wharf here 5th, was raised by Merritt & Chapman Wrecking Co. at 11.30 a. m. and left at 1 p. m. in tow of wrecking steamer for New York.

STEAMER SEATTLE LEAKING.
Marshfield, O., July 6.—Ferry star City of Seattle, from Seattle for San Francisco, in off Coos Bay in tow of str William Chatham, leaking badly.

SCHOONER LAUNCHED.
Schooner Courtney C. Houck was launched July 7 from the yard of G. G. Deering & Co., Bath, Me. Her measurements are—Length, 218 feet; breadth, 42.7 feet; depth, 24 feet; gross measurement, 1,627.89 tons.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.
Steamer Ohlndene (Nor), reports July 5, lat 33 07 N, lon 73 55 W, passed a red cylindrical buoy surrounded by a staff with five black cross trees attached.

Steamer El Norte reports July 26, lat 32 N, lon 76 03 W, saw a piece of timber about 75 feet long and 2 feet in diameter, covered with barnacles.

MEXICAN FEDERALS MAKE GUN OUT OF OLD LOCOMOTIVE AXLE

General Carranza, leader of the constitutional forces now waging an active campaign against the administration of President Huerta of Mexico, transformed his machine shop at Piedras Negras, Mexico, into an arsenal for the manufacture of artillery. Old locomotive axles were hauled out and mounted on wheels for use against the regular troops. Jackets were brazed on these improvised gun barrels to strengthen them. One of these guns is shown in the accompanying picture. General Carranza is standing with his hand on the wheel of the carriage. The other pictures show General Carranza and his secretaries and Pablo Villa, commanding the rebels.

Ask Water Extension.
Commissioner Wigmore has received an application for an extension of the water system to Beaconsfield avenue. The proposal is to connect a pipe to the eight-inch Bay Shore Road main, lead it through Beaconsfield field avenue and thence to join the two-inch pipe on Sea street.

To Open New Road.
A new road is to be opened by the provincial government from Fairville to Duck Cove. It will connect the lower end of Blenheim street with the Sand Cove Road.

Increase in Shipbuilding.
Wilmington, July 11.—There were 1,648 vessels, aggregating 392,304 gross tons, built in the United States during the fiscal year ended June 30, according to the department of commerce. This was the largest construction since 1908. Compared with the fiscal year, 1911, although the number of vessels constructed was not so great, there was an increased tonnage of 138,512 tons. Of the 121 metal steam vessels constructed, 36 were built on the Great Lakes.

Smallpox Spreading.
Sydney, N. S. W., July 11.—Smallpox, which has been prevalent here for some time, is spreading. Fifty thousand persons have been vaccinated and there are sixty-one cases in quarantine.

To Suppress White Slavery.
Ottawa, July 11.—The Dominion government has been asked, and has expressed its willingness, to co-operate in the world-wide movement for the suppression of the white slave traffic. The International Association which is directing the movement, is elaborating a plan whereby young girls traveling as immigrants or otherwise, may be kept under careful watch and protected from the overtures of those engaged in the traffic.
