New York, Feb. 4. Gold 113. Exchange killed, and many injured near Philadelphia yesterday by the explosion of a steam boiler in Woodard Bros. rolling mill.

London, Feb. 4. The proprietors of a colliery in South Wales, who have announced their intention to import Chinamen to take the place of men now on a strike, have received anonymous letters threatening assassination should they carry out their design.

The weather during the past three days has been intensely cold, and one hundred persons were frozen to death in England during that time.

An earthquake at the city of Lebrun, territory of Sciende, was attended by a dreadful destruction of human life. Foundations shook, and the earth rose and fell; hundreds of dwellings were laid in ruins.

The inhabitants rushed into the streets, where many met death from falling buildings, while those who remained within were, in many instances, hurried among the ruins. It is estimated that upwards of five hundred persons have perished.

TROOPS DISPERSING LABORERS. The Czech delegates of the Bohemian Diet attempted to meet at Prague, Monday, to protest against the holding of diocesan elections, but troops dispersed the assembly.

SUSPECTED INCENDIARIES. Three stores occupied by Pawcett, Crawford and Monahan at Litchfield, were burned on Monday—loss \$130,000. Pawcett was arrested on suspicion of incendiaries.

MORE RING EXPOSURES. Startling disclosures relative to the New York Ring frauds are being made. It is ascertained that the special Board of Audit is responsible for thefts amounting to \$400,000,000.

FATAL BOILER EXPLOSION. The boiler explosion at Conshohocken, Penn., proves more terrible than that at Pittsburg, eleven persons being killed and nearly twenty wounded.
