## SCHEDULE D.

The following articles shall be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of two hundred dollars, together with the forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, viz:

Books, printed papers, drawings, paintings, prints, photographs, or representations of any kind of a treasonable or seditious, or of an immoral or indecent character.

Foreign reprints of British copyright works copyrighted in . Canada and Canadian copyrighted works.

Coin, base or counterfeit.

## Articles added to Free List under Authority of Order in Council.

Gas coke, when used in Canadian manufactures only Woollen rags

Glass, bent, for manufacture of show cases, provided it is not made

Steel, imported for use in the manufacture of skates.

Musk, in pods or in grains.

Must, in pods or in grains.

White shellac, for manufacturing purposes.

Jute cloth, as taken from the loom, neither pressed, mangled, calendered, nor in any way finished, and not less than 42 inches wide, when imported to be manufactured into begs only.

Salt cake, being a sulphate of sods, when imported by manufacturerers of glass and soap for their own use in their works.

"Foot grease," the refuse of cotton seed after the oil is pressed

Tagging metal, plain, japanned or coated, in coils not over 14 ins.
