Final Returns not Yet in. The returns of the campaign for the new G.W.V.A. quarters are not all in as yet. Quite a number have yet to be reported. Within a few days it is expected that all figures from the various places of employment where cards were left will be in. As to the total amount raised no statement is available but it is expected to be around the \$10,000 mark.

Struck by a speeding Sarnia street car while turning her car on the street Mrs. Nelson George of Sarnia was so badly injured that she died a few minutes later in the Hospital. Whether she was rushed in the ambulance. Two small children who were with their mother in the car escaped unscathed. The car was of Sarnia and not fitted with air brakes although there have been several serious accidents.

Highway Route Determined. The route of the Provincial Highway through Brant county has been announced by the Commission, and the route plans have been deposited in the Registry office. Beginning at 12 o'clock noon on June 27, the route will be vested in the Crown. It goes from Brantford to Paris along the toll road, and beyond Paris it runs to Falkland then north to the Governor's road and west to the limits of the county. The toll road therefore, again passes out of the hands of the County Council after a short term of possession of only a few months.

New Priest Appointed. Appointments of assistant priests for parishes in the county, district are announced as follows: Rev. H. Fallon is made assistant at the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Windsor. Rev. M. Balligoun, St. Alphonsus Church, Windsor, is to be stationed at Tecumseh. Three new parishes for London Diocese are also announced; one at Leamington where Rev. Gibson will officiate one at Tilbury, and one at Belle River and Tecumseh where appointments not yet been made.

Welcomed Home Yesterday. Sergeant H. E. Erb, an old Kitchener boy who has just come back on the Royal George from overseas, is visiting for a few days at his parents Mr. and Mrs. U. Erb, R. R. No. 1, Waterloo. Sgt. Erb enlisted with the 4th Battery, 8th Brigade at Kingston and had over three years' active service in the great war.

In the last year he was promoted to the Typographical section, and is now still in the service at Ottawa helping in the completion of the narrative work of the Canadian part in the war. Mr. Erb was amongst those who followed closely the retreat of the Germans, and was among the Canadians who visited the Rhine cities of Bonn, Coblenz and Wiesbaden. Sgt. Erb is a nephew of Messrs. R. D. and E.

Highways Route. The official intimation of the route of the provincial highway from Brantford to Oxford County has been received and the plans deposited in the registry office. From Brantford to Paris the route follows the toll road purchased by the city and county last year. From Paris the route runs to Falkland, north to the Governor's road; then west to the boundaries of Oxford.

Mayor's Successful defense. The charge of assault preferred by J.H. Minshall who was represented by W.S. Brewster K.C., against Mayor McBride of Brantford was heard by Magistrate Livingston. Mayor McBride conducted his own case and won, the charge being dismissed.

Open Verdict Returned. That Badros Anigian came to his death at the hands of a person or persons unknown was the verdict brought in after nearly two months' deliberation by the coroner's jury at St. Catharines. Anigian was shot in the doorway of his store on Ontario Street on April 28th. Chief of Police Greene gave testimony that the evidence given at a previous sitting of the inquest by Frank Boyd was the truth. Boyd, a youth now employed on a boat running out of Toronto, failed to attend a sitting of the inquest when ordered. The jurors before closing the enquiry sent the Chief to Toronto to investigate the statements given by Boyd for his non-appearance. Two Armenians who are being held will come up before the Magistrate tomorrow. No direct evidence was given at the inquest connecting them with the crime.

This is the second open verdict on murder cases returned by coroners' juries in St. Catharines within the past two months, and the police have no clues in either case. The shooting of Pasquale Catalano in rear of De Conza's store, Geneva Street, a few weeks ago, makes the third mystery to baffle the police within the past two months.

Sir Lomer Gouin Retains Power. TWO LABORITES ELECTED. MONTREAL, June 23.—Sir Lomer Gouin goes back to power in Quebec with a slightly reduced majority as the result of the provincial elections to-day. His former strength was 75 Liberals to six Conservatives. His present strength, leaving out Pontine and Temiskaming, both of which returned Liberals last election but for which are not to head to-night, is 68 Liberals, against nine Conservatives and two Labor men. Labor is represented for the first time officially at Quebec men who have formerly run under the name having been straight Liberals. The Government lost three seats on the Island of Montreal, Maisonneuve, Laval and Dorion. In the first and last Labor replaces Liberal in Laval it is straight Conservative gain; Maisonneuve is the scene of Sir Lomer Gouin's speech last week. The Conservatives lost only one seat, Charlevoix-Saguenay. By not con-
