S. of the late R. N. Watts, Esq., who represented Drummond in Can. Assembly from 1841 to 1851. Ed. at McGill University, where he took degree of B.A., 1866, and that of B.C.L., 1869. Called to the Bar of Quebec, 1869. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, Feb. 1874, on resignation of sitting mem. Re-elected at g.e. 1875, at ge. 1878, and again at last g.e. A Conservative.—
