

Senator, by his first wife, Miss Brown. B. in Co. Cavan, Irel. Ed. in Toronto. M. the dau. of the late Judge Sherwood, of that city. Called to the Bar, U.C., in Trinity Term, 1839. Created Q.C., 1867. Is head of the law firm of Crawford & Crombie; Presdt. of the Royal Canadian Bank, of the Imperial Building, Savings and Investment Society, and of the Canada Car Co., a Bencher of the Law Society of Ontario (elected 1871), and Lieut.-Col. 5th Batt. Toronto Militia. Has been Presdt. of the Toronto and Nipissing Railway Co. Sat for Toronto East in Can. Assembly from 1861 to g.e., 1863, when defeated, and for South Leeds, in House of Commons, from the Union until 1872. Returned, for present seat, at last g.e.
